

BIBLIOGRAPHY

The following bibliography is in two sections. The first, in two parts, includes only those sources cited in the footnotes of the text, listed in the style of their citation followed by their details. The exceptions are newspapers, novels, academic journals, political and commercial treaties, unpaginated or inconsistent prefaces, statutes and legal documents, and other regular publications. These are detailed either in the body of the text or in the footnotes themselves. Some literary journals are cited only by their dates of entry since there are several useful editions of each whose pagination and their contents differs to the extent that specific references would serve only to mislead. However, each is followed by the editor used. The works of Louis Napoleon and the poetry can be found in any reliable edition of the works of Napoleon III and the poets quoted, and as these are numerous and do not differ substantially they have also not been cited outside references in the text. Works published in French have been avoided other than certain standard texts; but where an English translation, or an English language version, is available this has been preferred. References to facts, figures, and dates have also not been cited except where controversy requires it, as for example with the *coup d'état*. The second section contains full details of all the material mentioned in the text and a general bibliography of the uncited material employed for the writing of this book. All publications were issued in London unless otherwise stated.
